



What is its name?

1. The animal I'm going to tell you about can be found domesticated or in the wild. The domesticated species is naked, blind and helpless at birth; it is raised for meat and for pelt. The wild species is hunted for meat. Both species feed on grass, forbs, leafy weeds, and dry bread. And they love carrots!

What is the name of this animal?

2. Now let's see if you guess the name of this other animal. It's a very noble animal and it was one of the first to be domesticated by man. It has been very useful as means of transportation or draft animal in farming. During day time, these animals live outside, grazing on grasses, In the evening, they return to the stable. Under cold weather and bad winter conditions, especially in countries with snow, these animals stay in the stable and feed on hay. The characteristic sound uttered by these animals is called neigh; their females are called mares.

3. This question is about a domesticated bird usually raised for its eggs and delicious and nutritious meat. These animals are permitted to roam freely in the farmyard or in open-air pens and they feed on everything from meal leftovers to fruit or vegetable peelings, but they love scratching at the soil to search for seeds, insects, and worms.

4. Let's talk again about a mammal. Despite its reputation for dirtiness, this animal is very clean and, unlike many domestic animals, it is known for its intelligence. The upper part of its leg is dried and smoked after being salted and is then known as bacon. This animal's voice is the grunt and its female is called sow.

5. Now we are going to talk about a bird that loves water and lives there most of the time. This bird has short legs and webbed feet adapted for swimming. Once born, this bird looks right away for a place with water, even a small ditch will do, but it prefers a lake! And it knows already how to swim; and since it has waterproof feathers, it does not get wet!

6. This mammal I'm now going to speak about is most certainly one of the most important farm animals. This animal is farmed for meat and leather, and it produces most of the milk people drink. With its milk, we can obtain cheese, butter, yogurt and other dairy products like cream. This animal's voice is the moo.
