What is its name?

1. The animal I'm going to tell you about can be found domesticated or in the wild. The domesticated species is naked, blind and helpless at birth; it is raised for meat and for pelt. The wild species is hunted for meat. Both species feed on grass, forbs, leafy weeds, and dry bread. This animal loves carrots!

2. This question is about a domesticated bird usually raised for its eggs and delicious and nutritious meat. These animals are permitted to roam freely in the farmyard or in open-air pens and they feed on everything from meal leftovers to fruit or vegetable peelings, but they love scratching at the soil to search for seeds, insects, and worms.
